### **QUESTION & ANSWER**

(This week we continue on with Cardinal Collins' statement on the Discovery of Children's Remains at former Kamloops Residential School). Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Residential Schools

### 5. Have Indigenous leaders met with the Pope?

Yes, in 2009, the National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations, Phil Fontaine, along with other Indigenous representatives, had a moving encounter with Pope Benedict XVI at the Vatican. In describing the meeting, Chief Fontaine told the media he hoped the expression of regret would "close the book" on the issue of apologies for residential school survivors.

Another attendee at the meeting with Pope Benedict, Edward John, Grand Chief of the First Nations Summit in British Columbia, said the Pope acknowledged the suffering of those who are still living with the effects of their experiences at the schools. In comments to the media he said, "I think in that sense, there was that apology that we were certainly looking for."

The Catholic Church continues to work alongside and with Indigenous communities in order to foster an ongoing culture of reconciliation. There have been, and continue to be, numerous initiatives by Catholic dioceses, institutes and organizations throughout Canada to assist with support the ongoing healing and reconciliation journey.

### 6. I understand there was a formal request in the Truth and Reconciliation Commission report for the Pope to personally apologize in Canada?

The Holy Father has already been invited to Canada by the present and previous Prime Minister. The Catholic Bishops of Canada, including the current and past Presidents of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, have assured the Pope they would joyfully and gratefully welcome him in a visit to Canada. Likewise, in a number of instances, Canadian Bishops, individually and collectively, have formally invited Pope Francis to visit, including with specific reference to Call to Action #58 (a recommendation of the 2015 Truth & Reconciliation Commission asking the Holy Father to apologize on Canadian soil within one year of the report being issued).

Pope Francis has encouraged the Bishops to continue taking leadership and assuming their proper role in pursuing their pastoral engagement and reconciliation efforts with Indigenous peoples, including ongoing conversations among the Bishops and Elders.

## **Outpour of good wishes and prayers for Pope Francis**

### Religious leaders, civil authorities and faithful across the world pray for Pope Francis' speedy recovery.

The Pope Emeritus, Church authorities, and world leaders across the globe have sent their assurances of prayers and good wishes to Pope Francis as he recovers from surgery in Rome's Gemelli Hospital.

The Pope underwent programmed surgery on Sunday evening and, according to medical bulletins, he is doing well.

The Director of the Holy See Press Office said on Tuesday Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI is praying for the Pope's speedy recovery.

Matteo Bruni said the Pope Emeritus' personal secretary, Archbishop Georg Ganswein, said "Pope Benedict is thinking of the Pope with affection and is praying for him".

### A chorus of voices

Meanwhile a chorus of voices of closeness and support is reaching the Pope in hospital. Amongst them the President of the Italian Episcopal Conference, Cardinal Gualtiero Bassetti, who said the faithful are hoping and praying they will see him appear again soon at the window of the Apostolic Palace for the Sunday Angelus.

The Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, Bartholomew I, immediately sent a message of "Fraternal wishes for a speedy convalescence" adding that he trusts in the success of the operation, so that they may meet again soon "in order to carry out together the indispensable mission of unity, to which Christ calls us."

A message of good wishes from the Grand Imam of Al Azhar, Ahmad al-Tayyeb, addressed to "my dear brother" confirms the fraternal friendship that binds them and wishes him a quick recovery "that will return him to his mission for humanity."

"May the Lord sustain him with the tenderness of his love" was the prayer from the Anglican Center of Rome while the Chief Rabbi of Rome, Riccardo Segni tweeted: "My best wishes for a speedy recovery to the Pope who is facing a difficult surgery."

The Community of Sant'Egidio has also expressed closeness to the Pope and said that during its evening prayer dedicated to the sick, there is a special invocation and request for protection for Pope Francis, "so that he may soon return to health to fully exercise his ministry as a father and pastor."
