ALL SAINTS' DAY

All Saints' Day, 1 November makes good on the promise given to us on Easter Sunday. On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the victory of the God-Man over evil; whereas on All Saints, we celebrate the victory of frail human beings over evil. With the help of God and the grace (His Life) which He gives to each person, we are only able to overcome evil. Let us remember that the Saints are not super-human or that holiness is outside the reach of each one of us. Holiness requires only the constant submission to the leading of the Holy Spirit in our lives, moment by moment.

In the first reading of the day for All Saints', taken from Revelation 7:2-4,9-14, St. John can still discern ethnic differences in heaven. This suggests to us that some of the distinctive of our different ethnic and cultural backgrounds are good in themselves; they enrich the Church and will be erased in the age to come. This countless multitude of Christians down through the ages from every nation, tribe and tongue, have joined the Israelite "core" of the Church to praise the Triune God. This Sunday let enjoy a Happy All Hallowed Eve.

ALL SOULS' DAY

On this day 2 November, we pray for those who have died. We seek consolation for those who grieve without implying canonization of everyone who has died. It is never easy to balance the themes of hope and consolation with those of repentance and judgement.

The reality of Purgatory, which is a dogma of the Church, is something we Catholics inherited from our Jewish forefathers. We remember the souls in Purgatory in the various Eucharistic Prayers, every time Mass is celebrated. This mysterious place of which we know just a little, is a place of great suffering and of joy. Suffering, because the individual soul has to make restitution for his/her sins, if the person did not do so while living on earth, and joy because the person knows his/her fight for salvation is over and that Heaven awaits him/her at the end of their sojourn in Purgatory.

I like to refer to it as the lobby into heaven. While in that lobby, however long God deems right for each individual soul, the Church has taught that those suffering souls cannot pray for themselves. We the Church on earth and the Church in Heaven pray for those souls in Purgatory, where at the end of their sojourn, they will be perfected, that is to say, they will become the persons whom God has always wanted them to be.

Purgatory is not an in-between state of Heaven and Hell. Nor is it a "second chance" place if one did not live a virtuous and faith-filled life on Earth. Purgatory is part of Heaven; it will come to an end when the last person leaves it.

Let us pray for the Souls in Purgatory as they pray for us on Earth who are battling to get to our Eternal Home.
