<u>COMMUNION SERVICES &</u> <u>PRIVATE PRAYER AT THE PARISH</u>

St. Francis de Sales parish will be open for **private prayer from Monday to Thursday from 10:30am to 12:30pm.** We are only allowed to have **10 individuals at a time including clergy and staff/ volunteers in the Church.** Please be mindful of the time you give to private prayer in the parish as there are other people who would like the opportunity to do the same.

We will be having Communion Services. Only 8 people are allowed to attend each 5 minute Communion Service. Please note this is not the celebration of Mass. To attend this Communion Service, you will have to register on Eventbrite. To access Eventbrite, please visit our website at <u>www.stfrancisdesales.ca</u> This Communion Service is limited only to Saturday evening and Sunday at specific times. This does not extend to the other days of the week.

For the times of the Communion Service, please see Eventbrite. Please arrive early. If you are late for your Communion Service the entrance door to the parish will be locked and you will have to register for another date.

The Sacrament of Confession will be offered on Saturdays from 4pm to 4:45pm in the North and/or South Rooms.

REFLECTION

One of the four dogmas concerning Mary is that of her virginity. We celebrate her Immaculate Conception on 8 December; Mary's Assumption into Heaven, we celebrate on 15 August; Our Lady's motherhood we celebrate on 1 January. But there is not date in the Church's calendar on which we celebrate her perpetual virginity.

The Church attaches great importance to virginity because of Martyrdom. There are two forms of martyrdom that we admire: red martyrdom where on sheds one's blood for the faith: and white martyrdom. where one sacrifices one's sexual life for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Our Lady was not the only virgin we know of from the pages of Sacred Scripture; there was Our Lord, St. Joseph, St. John the Baptist, St. John the Apostle and Evangelist and St. Paul to name a few. From the earliest days of Christianity, the Catholic Church has always believed that Mary remained a virgin before, during and after the birth of Jesus. Committing herself as a virgin. Mary became a mother by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Sacred Scripture tells us that Jesus had "brothers and sisters." In the Hebrew language of Jesus' day and in Aramaic (the language spoken by Jesus), there were no equivalent of "cousin." The people of that day referred to their cousins as brothers or sisters. Furthermore, the Hebrew people in Jesus' time looked upon their fellow Jews as one big family under the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.


