The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Assumption is the oldest feast day of Our Lady,

Its origin is lost in those days when Jerusalem was restored as a sacred city, at the time of the Roman Emperor Constantine (c. 285-337)....

For 200 years, every memory of Jesus was obliterated from the city, and the sites made holy by His life, death and Resurrection became pagan temples.

After the building of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in 336, the sacred sites began to be restored and memories of the life of Our Lord began to be celebrated by the people of Jerusalem. One of the memories about his mother centered around the "Tomb of Mary," close to Mount Zion, where the early Christian community had lived.

On the hill itself was the "Place of Dormition," the spot of Mary's "falling asleep," where she had died. The "Tomb of Mary" was where she was buried.

....In the seventh century, it began to be celebrated in Rome under the title of the "Falling Asleep" ("Dormitio") of the Mother of God.

Soon the name was changed to the "Assumption of Mary," since there was more to the [solemnity] than her dying. It also proclaimed that she had been taken up, body and soul, into heaven.



That belief was ancient, dating back to the apostles themselves. What was clear from the beginning was that there were no relics of Mary to be venerated, and that an empty tomb stood on the edge of Jerusalem near the site of her death. That location also soon became a place of pilgrimage. (Today, the Benedictine Abbey of the Dormition of Mary stands on the spot.)

REFLECTION

This Sunday 15 August, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary's Assumption body and soul into heaven. Although it is not recorded in Sacred Scripture, it has been part of the Tradition (the oral handing down of the faith before the New Testament was written) of the Church.

There are several assumptions of body and soul in the Old Testament. Enoch in Genesis 5:24 and Elijah in 2 Kings 2:11 were assumed into heaven. The Book of Jude in the New Testament alludes to the possibility that Moses could have been assumed into heaven body and soul (Jude 1:9).

St. John the Apostle and Evangelist gives us a scriptural account of Mary's whereabouts in the Book of Revelation (Rev 11:19-12:5). When St. John sees heaven, he sees Jesus as the New Temple and he sees Mary as the New Ark of the New Covenant. In the Old Testament, the most important "artifact" in the Jerusalem Temple was the Ark (in which was held a jar of Manna, the stone tablets of the 10 Commandments and Aaron's staff). This Ark was placed in a room called the Holy of Holies. When David was king, one of his first priorities was to "bring up" the Ark into Jerusalem and place it "inside" a makeshift tent. (It would be Solomon, David's son who would build the Temple in Jerusalem).

Now if Jesus is the new David (and the Son of David) who ascended to the heavenly Jerusalem where the heavenly Temple is located, it would make sense that He would likewise bring the true Ark of the New Covenant, Mary, into His heavenly Temple.

Even St. Luke the Evangelist describes Mary as the New Ark (see St. Luke Chps 1-2). If the Ark was held the mysterious bread known as Manna, then Our Lady carried within her womb, the Bread of Life. If the Ark also held the 10 Commandments, then Mary carried within her womb, the Divine Law Giver Himself. If the Ark also held Aaron's miraculous staff signifying his priesthood, then Mary carried within her womb, the Divine High Priest.

One has to remember that it was to St. John the Apostle at the foot of the Cross that Mary was given to as his mother. He would have seen Mary's end of days. And then to see her in the fullness of life in heaven as he saw Our Lady as described in Revelation, St. John would have been overjoyed.

This solemnity should have some spiritual interest for us. Simply put, what happen to Mary will happen to us faithful Christians. As Our Lady bore Christ into the world, we bear Him in the Holy Communion we receive and in the witness of His Indwelling Presence in our life. As Mary was sinless (immaculate), so too will we one day be sinless with God in heaven. Finally as Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven, so too will we be there one day, body and soul.
