

<u>COMMUNION SERVICES &</u> <u>PRIVATE PRAYER AT THE PARISH</u>

St. Francis de Sales parish will be open for **private prayer from Monday to Thursday from 10:30am to 12:30pm.** We are only allowed to have **10 individuals at a time including clergy and staff/ volunteers in the Church.** Please be mindful of the time you give to private prayer in the parish as there are other people who would like the opportunity to do the same.

We will be having Communion Services. Only 8 people are allowed to attend each 10 minute Communion Service. Please note this is not the celebration of Mass. To attend this Communion Service, you will have to register on Eventbrite. To access Eventbrite, please visit our website at <u>www.stfrancisdesales.ca</u> This Communion Service is limited only to Saturday evening and Sunday at specific times. This does not extend to the other days of the week.

For the times of the Communion Service, please see Eventbrite. If you are late for your Communion Service the entrance door to the parish will be locked and you will have to register for another date and time. Out of love for neighbour, we encourage you to register not more than once every two weeks to allow other parishioners to attend.

The Sacrament of Confession will be offered on Saturdays from 4pm to 4:45pm in the North and/or South Rooms.

ONLINE DONATIONS

Dear parishioners,

If you are not able to attend, but still wish to donate, here are the ways in which you can continue to support our parish at this time:

- Mail your regular weekly offertory contribution to the parish or drop off to the parish locked mailbox by the office door, or drop off in the donations box at Mass.
- Online donations can be made at <u>www.archtoronto.org</u>. Simply click on the donate now icon, select St. Francis de Sales parish from the drop down menu and the fund you wish to donate to. This can be done as a onetime donation or as an ongoing monthly donation. It will give you a place to choose that option.
- Contribute through pre-authorized giving. You can obtain a form from the parish website. Mail the completed form and a voided cheque to the parish office. Or e-mail the form and a scanned copy or photo of a voided cheque to <u>development@archtoronto.org</u> for processing. Contributions are withdrawn from your bank account on the 20th of each month.

QUESTION AND ANSWER

On Sunday 11 April, the first reading from the Acts of Apostles, it stated: *"The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. There was not a need person among them for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the Apostles' feet and it was distributed to each as any had need"* (Acts 4:32-35). Does this mean that the early Church was socialist or communist?

This passage from Acts is not about socialism, as socialism/communism does not bear witness to the Resurrection of Christ. Stated in that above quote is this line: "With great power the Apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all." The apostolic communities and many other Christian communities that followed them, were driven by religious motivation. They were voluntary movements wherein Christians agreed to sell property and share things by their own choice. They were not under any compulsion by a coercive socialist or communist state that everyone, under the treat of punishment, sell and share all resources.

We recall in the Gospel that the Good Samaritan as well as Zacchaeus all voluntarily gave their own wealth or earnings as free will acts, not as a forced response or threat to or from some authority.

Sacred Scripture attests to the right of private property. One of the Ten Commandments states: *Thou shall not steal*. To steal is to take someone's property which is a basic right according to the Bible and to Natural Moral Law, which God has inscribed in our being.

I pray that all of our First Communion families are well. As you have heard in the news, effective Monday April 19th, all in person religious services will be capped at 10 PEOPLE only. These restrictions will remain in effect for four weeks, which will unfortunately affect our dates for First Communion. Father and I will send out the First Communion preparation videos to complement what the children are learning in their books, a little closer to the First Communion dates.
