


Imitate Christ and Be Inspired by Remembering that...

REFLECTION

This week we look at the fourth phrase of Jesus from the Cross: **"My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?"** with the help of the late Bishop Fulton Sheen. This fourth phrase symbolizes the sufferings of man abandoned by God.

Just as the sun's light can be withdrawn from us by the intervening clouds, though the sun remains in the sky, so there was a kind of withdrawal of His Father's face in the terrible moment in which Jesus took upon Himself the sins of the world. The pain and desolation Jesus suffered for each of us, that we might know what a terrible think it is for human nature to be without God, to be deprived of a divine remedy and consolation. It was atonement for all who have had faith and lost it; for all who once were saints and now are sinners. It was atonement for those who deny the presence of God: for all those Christians who abandon all effort when they cannot feel God near them; for all who identify being good with feeling good; for all skeptics, who asked, "Why has God commanded you?" It was reparation for all the haunting questions of a doubting world: "Why is there evil?" "Why does God no answer my prayers?" "Why did God take away my loved on?" It was a supreme act of atonement for 3 classes of people: those who abandon God; those who doubt the presence of God; and those who are indifferent to God.

This fourth phrase of Jesus from the Cross in the consecration of the Mass of Calvary. The first 3 phrases were spoken to humans but the last four are spoken to God. This fourth phrase was the cry of atonement for sin. Sin is the abandonment of God by man; it is the creature forsaking the Creator. Sin is a separation, a divorce, the original divorce from unity with God, whence all other divorces are derived. Since Jesus came on earth ton redeem us from sin, it was fitting He feel that abandonment, that separation, that divorce. Jesus felt it first internally in His soul. There was no sin in His soul, but since He willed to fell the effect of sin, an awful sense of isolation and loneliness crept over Him, the loneliness of being without God.

In order to reveal the intensity of that separation, Jesus revealed it by an external sign. Because man had separated himself from God, Jesus, in atonement, permitted His Blood to be separated from His Body. Sin had entered into the blood of man; and as if the sins of the world were upon Jesus, He drains the chalice of His Body of His Sacred Blood. We can almost hear Jesus say: "Father, This is My Body; this is My Blood. They are being separated from one another as humanity has been separated from you. This is the consecration of My Mass."
