"The soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin."

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Why do we Catholics have dietary laws, like no meat on Fridays?

The Catholic Church's practice of no meat on Friday is not a universal law. Where meat is not plentiful in parts of the world, it does not make sense. For those individual Catholics who are vegetarians, this practice would not make sense for them. Most Conferences of Catholic Bishops around the world have however, kept that practice of no meat on Fridays for their faithful.

There's nothing wrong with meat (where it is sinful on Friday but fine on the other days of the week). The practice of fasting came about that, since Jesus died for us on Friday, we should do something penitential like abstaining from all meats. This is in preparation for Sunday when we are expected to feast as it is the day of the Resurrection.

For us Catholics in Canada, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops still upholds the practice of no meat on all Fridays of the year. This practice is only superseded if a solemnity falls on a Friday (like Christmas Day or New Year's Day, to name just two). Our Canadian bishops have also taught that if you are going to eat meat on Fridays, then substitute it with something that is penitential. Remember fasting is for the good of the soul, whereas dieting is good for the body. (In the US, Catholics are only expected to abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent).

In fact, we Catholics do not have restrictive dietary laws like the Jews, Moslems and Hindus. The Church has gone in the opposite direction and always taught that there are two "foods" we should embrace: Bread (which is changed into the Body of Christ) and Wine (which is changed in the Blood of Christ) at Mass. At all times, the Catholic Church asks of us to examine our lives to know if we should or should not embrace those 2 foods. Taking our cue from St. Paul in his first Letter to the Corinthians, the sainted apostle tells us: Therefore, whoever eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself and so eat the bread and drink the cup drinks judgment on himself. That is why many among you are ill and infirm and a considerable number are dying. If we discerned ourselves, we would not be under judgment, but since we are judged by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we may not be condemned along with the world (1 Cor 11:27-32).

In other words, we should "restrict" ourselves from receiving the Eucharist if we are in the state of mortal sin. Just as those who are lactose intolerant, or those who have to take an insulin shot before eating foods that can do them harm, we believers need to go to Confession before receiving the Eucharist.
