

<u>RETURNING TO REGULAR MASS</u> TIMES AT ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

As of Tuesday 1 March, all churches will go back to 100% seating capacity. To that end, all the cords within the pews will be removed. Parishioners will still be required to wear their masks.

On Sunday 6 March, we will return back to our original Sunday Mass times: <u>8:30 AM, 10:15 AM, 12</u> <u>noon and 7 PM</u>. Congregational singing is encouraged as you will find hymnals in your pews.

You are still **required under Durham Region By-law** and Cardinal Collins to wear a facemask inside the building. **If you are ill, we ask that you stay home.**

ASH WEDNESDAY



Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of the year.

Fasting means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the full meal. Abstinence forbids the consumption of meat, but not of eggs or milk products. **Ash Wednesday is not a day of Mass obligation**.

ONLINE DONATIONS

REFLECTION

As we begin our Lenten journey this coming Ash Wednesday 2 March, I thought that it might be good to reflect on the seven last words (or phrases) of Christ on the Cross. Each week, we will "unpack" some of the meanings behind each of those words. With the help of the late Bishop Fulton Sheen, we will reflect on the first word: **"Forgive them Father for they do not know what they do."**

This first word is addressed to enemies. At the foot of the Cross, were various members of His congregation, this is those Pharisees and the Sanhedrin, the Roman soldiers and those hurling blasphemies to Christ on the Cross. He who preached "Love your enemies," and "Do good to those who hate you," would not forget them with pierced hands and feet. Why forgive them? If they knew what they were doing like the fallen angels, they would be excluded from that cry on the Cross. It is their ignorance of their grave sin that brought them within the pale of hearing that cry from the Cross.

This first word of Jesus from the Cross can also be compared to the *Confiteor* which we proclaim at the beginning of Mass. The *Confiteor* is a prayer to Mary and the saints to intercede to God for the forgiveness of our sins; for only the clean of heart can see God.

Our Lord begins His Mass on the Cross with a *Confiteor:* **"Forgive them Father for they do not know what they are doing."** But His *Confiteor* differs from ours in that Jesus has no sins to confess. He is God and therefore sinless. His *Confiteor* then cannot be a prayer for the forgiveness of His sins but it can be a prayer for the forgiveness of our sins. This first word of Jesus does not constitute an excuse for continued sin, but a motive for contrition and penance. Forgiveness is not a denial of sin and Our Lord does not deny the horrible fact of sin.

Some may indeed ask, how and why can a mere priest, a fellow sinner forgive others of their sins? Only God can forgive sin. To answer this question, we look at this very first word of Jesus from the Cross. <u>God can forgive sins</u> through man, for that is the way God forgave His executioners; namely through the instrumentality of His human nature. Why then is it not reasonable to expect Him still to forgive sins through other human natures (that is priests) to whom He gave that power? We attune ourselves to that first cry from the Cross for forgiveness in a great way, in the confessional.

The Confiteor at the foot of the altar is our cry of unworthiness; the Confiteor from the Cross is our hope of pardon and absolution. The wounds of Our Saviour were terrible, but the worst wound of all would be to be unmindful that we caused it all.
