

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD Every nation on earth will Adore you

... Lessons revealed in the Word

Lesson 1

The story of the three Magi "traveling from a foreign and non-Jewish nation" to see the baby Jesus reveals the important truth "that Jesus came for all people and all are called to adore Him".

<u>Lesson 2</u>

The Magi, "studied the stars and were aware of the Jewish belief that a Messiah was coming". This knowledge sparked in them a desire to seek the Lord. As in other Bible stories, we see that God will use what is familiar to us to call us to Him.

Lesson 3

When "the Magi fell prostrate before the Christ Child", they "laid their lives down before Him in complete surrender and adoration". Their actions provide a perfect example of worship.

Lesson 4

The Magi's gifts reveal that they "acknowledged this Child as the Divine King who would die to save us from sin". The gift of Gold represents His Kingship; frankincense, used in burnt offerings to God, represents His divinity and myrrh, used for burial preparation, points to the importance of His death. "If we are to adore Christ properly, we must also honor Him in this threefold way."

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

What is the feast of the Epiphany?

Epiphany commemorates the first occasion when the Gentiles (non-Jews) visited Jesus, the King of the Israel. Epiphany hints at an important truth about our faith: that it must be publicly revealed. To hold up to the veracity of what the Church would later proclaim to the world, this message that Jesus is God, must undergo scrutiny. Private revelation would and could not hold up to public scrutiny as anyone can make any false claim. God the Father lit the night sky to direct these mysterious visitors to His Son. Salvation is from the Jews, but not only for the Jews. God excludes no one from His saving design. There are many more epiphanies such as the Baptism of Our Lord, the Wedding Feast at Cana and the Transfiguration of Our Lord.

Who were the Magi?

The Magi were mysterious men from the East whose trade consisted in magic or astrology. Perhaps what they saw in the sky was a particular constellation which was associated with the Hebrew people. St. Matthew does not tell us how many Magi visited Jesus. We assume that it was three based on the three gifts.

What is the significance of the gifts given to the Baby Jesus?

Gold is offered in tribute to a king; frankincense (incense) acknowledges Him as the Priest of the New Covenant; and myrrh (a fragrant resin) points to fact that Jesus was a prophet who would shed His own blood to reconcile humanity with the Father. These gifts not only pointed to Jesus' identity as a King and God, but also pointed to His destiny as the One sent by the Father to die for mankind. These gifts also reflect the very things used in the Temple in Jerusalem, thereby signifying the priesthood of Jesus. Look closely at the mysteries of this day's celebration and you will see a marriage between heaven and earth. The Babe in Bethlehem is both God and man. He has a divine nature and a human nature.

Isn't Epiphany celebrated on 6 January?

Epiphany is usually celebrated around the world on 6 January. However, the Catholic Church in Canada, with the permission of the Holy See, decided to celebrate Epiphany on the first Sunday following the Solemnity of Holy Mary, Mother of God.





FIRST COMMUNION

We kindly remind our virtual school children and our children in Grade 3-6 to work on their First Reconciliation books at home. For our children who are in public schools or other Catholic schools outside of our parish boundaries, First Reconciliation classes will take place at the parish starting on Saturday January 22. First Reconciliation is tentatively booked for Saturday February 26.

If you have not yet picked up your book please email Noah immediately. A kind reminder that classes will be virtual and a link will be sent out this week. MARRIAGE & COMMUNION

Due to the many misconceptions regarding the Catholic Church and marriage, please note that a Catholic may marry a non-Catholic in the Catholic Church, without his or her conversion to the faith. In some instances, a person, who has been previously married, can also be married in the Catholic Church after consultation with the priest. If as a Catholic you're married outside of the Catholic Church without the permission of the Church, we respectfully ask that you refrain from receiving the Eucharist until your marriage has been validated ("sacramentalized") by a Catholic priest or deacon. To remedy this situation, please call one of the priests to make an appointment to have your marriage validated. We are only too happy to bring back to the couple, the graces necessary to live out their marriage, and to reconcile them with the graces of the Eucharist.
