

### **REFLECTION**

This week we look at the seventh phrase of Jesus from the Cross: **"Father into your hands, I commend my spirit"** with the help of the late Bishop Fulton Sheen.

If the sixth phrase was a cry of retrospect: "It is finished," then his seventh and last phrase is one of prospect: "I commend my spirit." The sixth phrase was manward; the seventh phrase was Godward. The sixth phrase was a farewell to earth; the seventh was His entrance into heaven. He who had come from Heaven and finished His work, now goes back to the Father to salute Him who sent Jesus out on the great work of the world's redemption.

The prodigal Son is returning to His Father's house, for is not Christ the prodigal? Thirty-three earlier, Jesus left His Father's eternal mansion and went off into the foreign country of this world. He began spending Himself and being spent; dispensing with an infinite prodigality the divine riches of power and wisdom, and bestowing with a heavenly liberality the divine gifts of pardon and mercy. In this last hour, His whole substance is wasted among sinners, for Jesus is giving the last drop of His Precious Blood for the redemption of the world. There is nothing to feed upon except the husks of human sneers, and the vinegar and gall of bitter human ingratitude. Jesus now prepares to take the road back to His Father's House, and when, yet some distance away, Jesus sees the face of His Heavenly Father, he breaks out into the last and perfect prayer from the pulpit of the Cross: "Father into your hands I commend my spirit."

As Jesus the High Priest began His Mass with "Father," ("Forgive them Father for they know not what they do") so He ends His Mass with the same word, "Father into your hands, I commend my spirit."

High Priest of Heaven and earth, Your Mass is finished. Leave the Altar of the Cross and repair into your Sacristy. As High Priest, You came forth from the Sacristy of Heaven, clothed in the vestments of Humanity and bearing Your Body as Bread and Your Blood as Wine. Now the Sacrifice has been consummated. The Consecration bell has rung. You offered your Spirit to Your Father, Your Body and Blood to man. There remains now nothing but the drained chalice. Enter your Heavenly sacristy. Take off your garments of mortality and put on the white robes of immortality. Show your Hands, Feet and Side to your Heavenly Father and say: "With these was I wounded in the house of those who love me."
