# Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

Excerpts from HOMILY OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

.... For the shepherds, the manger was a joyful sign: it was the confirmation of the message they had heard from the angel....

Yet such was not the case with Mary, the Holy Mother of God. She had to endure "the scandal of the manger". She too, ... received the message of an angel, who spoke to her solemnly about the throne of David.... And now, Mary has to lay him in a trough for animals.... How can she reconcile the glory of the Most High and the bitter poverty of a stable? ....

... Mary, instead... keeps all these things, pondering them in her heart... the expression of a mature, adult faith .... For spiritual fruitfulness is born of trials and testing....

.... The Gospel speaks of Mary "bringing together", comparing, her different experiences and finding the hidden threads that connect them.... she binds together the beautiful things and the unpleasant things....that the glory of the Most High appears in humility; she welcomes the plan of salvation whereby God must lie in a manger. She sees the divine Child frail and shivering, and she accepts the wondrous divine interplay between grandeur and littleness....

... And this is Mary's attitude: she keeps and ponders right up to Calvary.

.... At the beginning of the New Year, then, let us place ourselves under the protection of this woman, the Mother of God, who is also our mother. May she help us to keep and ponder all things, unafraid of trials and with the joyful certainty that the Lord is faithful and can transform every cross into a resurrection.... Amen.

## **REFLECTION**

This Sunday we continue looking at the connections between Christmas and Easter. On this New Year's Day, the eighth day of Christmas we read in St. Luke's Gospel, "When eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus, the name given him by the angel before he was conceived in the womb" (Lk 2:20).

Before 1974, when 1 January was dedicated to Mary the Mother of God by Pope St. Paul VI, it was previously known as "Circumcision day or Holy Name day." This shedding of Jesus' Precious Blood at His circumcision would be the first of seven times.

For the Jewish people, to covenant themselves with God was to "seven" oneself. The Hebrew word for "seven" was closely related to the word "to covenant."

Fast forward to Holy week where we read that the other six times that Jesus would shed His Blood are: sweating blood in Garden; being flogged at the pillar; being crowned with thorns; carrying His Cross; being nailed to the Cross and being speared in His side after Jesus dies.

Already only eight days after His birth, Jesus experiences excruciating pain in circumcision, as a foreshadowing at what would happen towards the end of His human life. We could say that the shadow of the Cross had reached back in time to that place in Bethlehem.

Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year. Next week we continue looking at the connections between the two great feasts of the Church.

I hope all of our youth had a blessed and safe Christmas weekend. Don't forget, just because the day is over, doesn't mean the season is! The season of Christmas in the church continues. Edge will begin again at the end of the month on Jan 27, 2023 from 7:30pm – 9:00pm (approx.).
